Wheelless Clocks.



HOG TROUGH OF CONCRETE.

Simple Rules for the Building of Valuable Utensil. G. M.-Please describe how to construct a cement hog trough. What is the best size and shape?

In making a concrete hog trough first lay the concrete floor, this answers for the bottom of a trough. 
