





EFFECTS OF THE TYPEWRITER.

Its Use Has Given Impetus to the Dictating Habit.

The invention of the typewriter has given a tremendous impetus to the dictating habit, especially among business men, says the Atlantic Monthly. The more ephemeral literary productions of the day are dictated, sometimes to a stenographer for transcription, and often directly to the machine. In either case the literary effects of the dictation habit are too manifest to need elaboration. The standards of spoken language, which marked contrast with the terseness and precision of written composition, giving rise to the saying that no good speech ever read well, have crossed over to the printed page.

This means not only greater diffuseness, inevitable with any lessening of the tax on words which the labor of the writing imposes, but it also brings forward the point of view of one who speaks. There is the disposition on the part of the talker to explain as if watching the facial expression of his hearers to see how far they were following.

This attitude is not lost when his audience becomes merely a clicking typewriter. It is no uncommon thing in the typewriting booths at the capitol in Washington to see congressmen, in dictating letters, use the most vigorous gestures, as if the oratorical methods of persuasion could be transmitted to the printed page.


