All Students to Report Names
of Soldiers and Sailors

A committee of the faculty division of the Patriotic league of the University of Nebraska met Tuesday for the purpose of discussing sending gifts of some sort at Christmas to the soldiers who have gone from the University of Nebraska. It has not been definitely decided yet just what will be sent, but the purpose is to reach every University man who has enlisted and left.

In order to have as complete a list as possible of former Nebraska men, it is urged that anyone knowing the address of a University soldier or sailor leave that address with some member of the faculty, or at The Daily Nebraskan office. It is important that the addresses be accurate, because otherwise it will be impossible to reach the men by mail. If the man is in the army, at least his regiment must be known, and still better, also his company. The addresses should be equally accurate for a man in the navy.

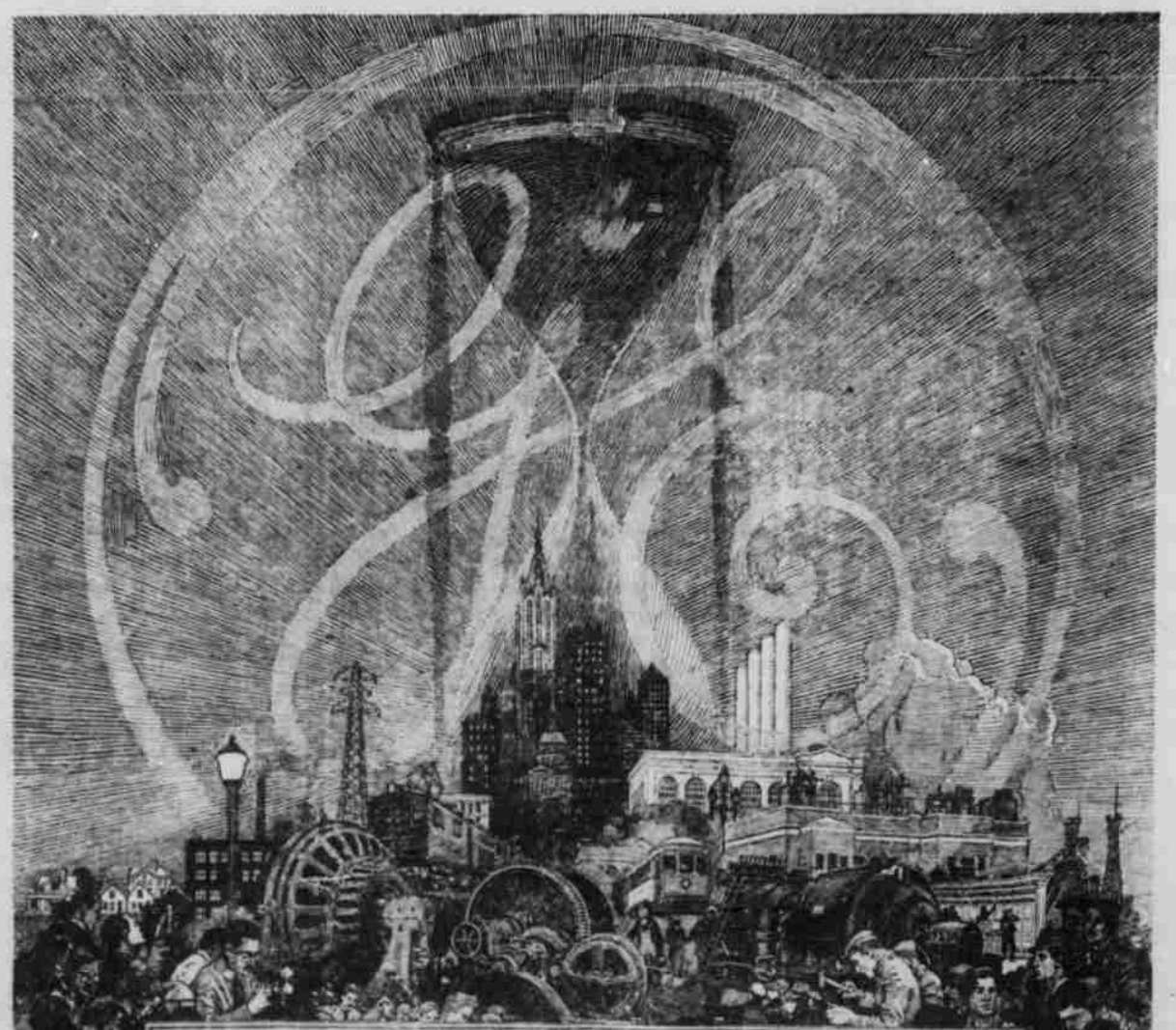
