**Basketball Practice**

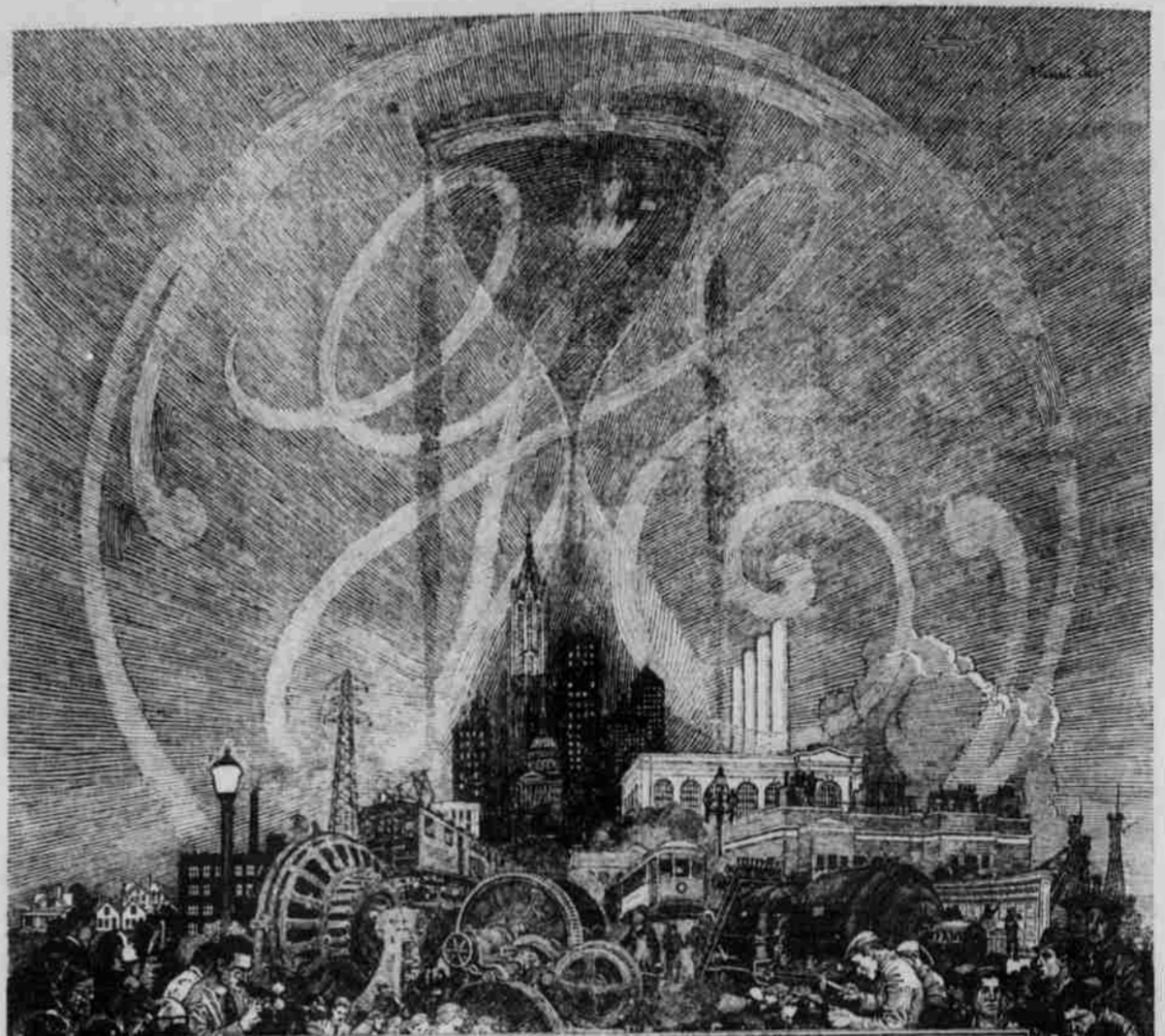
