

## Secretary Lane to Speak at Organized Agriculture

## Seldom, if ever, has the week of Thursday, Friday and Saturday Organized Agriculture brought as many famous speakers to Lincoln as will be present this year at the farmers' meetings from January 14 to 19. On Friday and Saturday of the week there will be a number of patriotic meetings. Among those who will speak are Franklin K. Lane, secretary of the interior, and Right Hon. Sir Frederick E. Smith, attorney general of Great Britain. Doctor Alonzo Taylor, representative of the food administration, who has just returned from France, and Ross Hammond, who has also been studying conditions in the war zone, will speak at these meet-Wednesday.

War problems will come in for discussion at all of the meetings and those present will have an unsual opportunity to learn just what the government is expecting of the farmer and the methods that others are planning to adopt to make war-time production certain and profitable.
