Secretary Lane to Speak at Organized Agriculture

Seldom, if ever, has the week of Organized Agriculture brought as many famous speakers to Lincoln as will be present this year at the farmers' meetings from January 14 to 19. On Friday and Saturday of the week there will be a number of patriotic meetings. Among those who will speak are Franklin K. Lane, secretary of the Interior, and Right Hon. Sir Frederick E. Smith, attorney general of Great Britain. Doctor Alonzo Taylor, representative of the food administration, who has just returned from France, and Ross Hammond, who has also been studying conditions in the war zone, will speak at these meetings. J. P. Cotton, chairman of the live stock price-fixing committee of the food administration, will speak Wednesday.

War problems will come in for discussion at all of the meetings and those present will have an unusual opportunity to learn just what the government is expecting of the farmer and the methods that others are planning to adopt to make war-time production certain and profitable. Programs of the week may be secured by addressing Extension Service, University Farm, Lincoln, Neb.

Thirty-Eight Nebraskans in Third R. O. T. C.

Thirty-eight Nebraskans are listed in the number of men that compose the Third Officers Training camp now stationed at Camp Funston, Kan., ac-

ording to a recent dispatch from that post. Nebraska stands second in the number of men which it has sent to this camp it being second to the Kemper military school with forty-two men enlisted. Other colleges with the number of men which have joined this division are: University of Wyoming, twenty-one; University of Idaho, twen-

ty-three, and the Colorado State Agricultural college, twenty-six.

The men from these colleges together with four hundred and fifty men of the eighty-ninth national army division make up the personnel of this body of soldiers in training at Funston preparatory to receiving commissions.
