It will be known definitely that Nebraska will be represented in the biggest national university event of the year.

Coach Stewart, Byron McMahon, "Ed." Smith, "Rudy" Fuchs, and John Gibbs will make the trip. Arriving in Chicago tomorrow morning they will have time for a morning workout on the University of Chicago track. They will then catch the afternoon Pennsylvania for "Philly." This will bring them to Philadelphia Friday afternoon in time for a workout on the big track.

A Test of Husker Spirit

Nebraska did not dream of turning out a prize track team until next season and the victory at Drake over Michigan, Chicago, Notre Dame and all Missouri Valley teams was a huge surprise. The athletic treasury was absolutely empty but the necessity of sending this winning quartet to the great national event became an immediate necessity. The last minute appeal for funds to carry this out is a genuine test of Cornhusker spirit and if the school gets back of the team today it will have reason to be proud of the performance. The boys may not win the event, but so far this season their time of 3:26 for the mile has been unequalled by any team in the country and Coach Stewart feels sure these sprinters can clip two seconds from that when they hit the cinders on Franklin Field.

The University of Pennsylvania golf varsity for this season will be chosen by elimination matches between twenty-five or more contestants. The actual winners will represent the school in the intercollegiate matches next month.
