JUDGE MUNGER TELLS OF WORK OF ATTORNEYS

"The most successful attorneys usually have notes at hand during the trial with similar cases and decisions recorded. Also they usually make notes of the order of procedure and follow them carefully," said Judge T. C. Munger of the Federal Court of Nebraska in his address to the future barristers of Nebraska Law College during the general lecture period, Friday, February 11.

Judge T. C. Munger has been a judge of the Federal Court for the past fourteen years. He previously practiced as an attorney for twentyone years. He has resided in the city of Lincoln during the past thirty-six years. He is well known and respecied throughout the territory surrounding Lincoln. Federal judges play a very important part in the administration of justice in all the important law questions that arise.

Judge Munger's address included many suggestions concerning the practical use of knowledge acquired in the College of Law.
