**NEBRASKA MAT
TEAM DEFEATS
GOPHER CREW**

Husker Wrestlers Win Five Falls
and One Decision in Meet
with Minnesota
Friday.

FINAL SCORE IS 28 to 3

Captain Brown of Northerners
Given Award Over Pick-
well in Feature Match
of Contest.

Husker grapplers climbed a notch
in the Western Intercollegiate stand-
ings when they defeated Minnesota
28 to 3 Friday night. The Nebraska
warriors won five falls and one de-
cision.

The welterweight scrap was the
best of the evening. Captain Brown
of Minnesota won over Pickwell by
a ten-second advantage after the
match had gone to two extra three-
minute periods.

Reed, Husker middleweight, flopped
Porzadekin in one minute 55 seconds
with a bar arm and body lock. Reed
rushed his man off his feet at the
start, and soon had his shoulders
touching the canvas.

Probst, clever Nebraska bantam,
had Babcock looking at the rafters in
1 minute, 35 seconds. Probst secured
the fall with an arm scissors and
body lock.

Captain Trautman showed his usual
good form when he threw Catanzero
with a leg scissors and reverse nel-
son. The fall came after 2 minutes
and 15 seconds of clever defensive
work on the part of Catanzero; but
he was unable to stave off defeat.

Renner had Clapp, Gopher heavy,
on the mat in 7 minutes and 55 sec-
onds. A body scissors and a half nel-
son caused the downfall of Clapp.

Halverson fell victim to Isaacson
after ten minutes, 35 seconds of hard
scrapping. Halverson was unable to
squirm out of a body chancery.

Kellogg ran up three points for the
Huskies when he won a decision over
Leahy, Minnesota featherweight grap-
pler. Kellogg was behind his man
most of the time.

This was the next to the last match
for the Husker matmen. They will
meet the Iowa University team next
Friday at Iowa City.

**NEBRASKA QUINTET
TRIMS WASHINGTON**

Husker Cagesters Win Final
Conference Game of
Season.

Nebraska dropped the curtain on
its conference basketball season Fri-
day night by defeating Washington
24 to 22 on the Lincoln floor. The
game was pleasing to the crowd keep-
ing the spectators in suspense until
the final whistle.

During the first frame, the Husker
cagers completely out-played the St.
Louis team tossing in two shots to
the visitors one. Washington was
forced to try long shots and on sev-
eral occasions Minner found the hoop
from the center of the floor. The
count stood 14 to 8 at the end of the
first half.

Minner started the second half with
a free throw for the Pikers and
started the steady climb of the Wash-
ington quintet that put them out in
front 20 to 18. Cozier then caged
a long shot and sang another that
gave Nebraska a two-point margin.
Usher followed with the next marker
that salted the game for the Scarlet
and Cream squad.

With less than a minute to play,
Minner broke through the Nebraska
defense and sank the leather for
Washington's last counter after
neither side had scored for more than
seven minutes. The game ending 24
to 22.

Kennedy Cozier led the Nebraska
scoring, finding the basket for long
shots and throws from different
angles with a total of 8. Usher fol-
lowed with 6 points in the Husker
score column.

For the Pikers, the main brunt was
born by Minner who is the same for-
ward that upset the Husker hopes at
St. Louis last week. Minner made 14
of the Washington tally. Minner led
