 The actual burial place of Tutankhamen and that the mummy found was the real mummy. Among these men were Prof. T. E. Peet, Georges Rene, and Professor Schiaparelli. Some

believed that this was merely a hiding place for King Tutankhamen's treasures and others thought that the tomb belonged to a more recent ruler.

This latest discovery made only yesterday substantiates their belief and discredits the much-heralded explorations of the English archeologists, Carter and Carnarvon.

An Egyptian law which states that if a tomb is opened, a division of the treasures must be made with the government, must have been the cause for the abduction of the original burial place of Tutankhamen.

King Tutankhamen was a lover of music and dance. During his regime as ruler of Egypt he was always attended by beautiful dancers. It is
