Black Concentrates on New Offensive System for Kansas Aggie Contest

SQUAD IN GOOD SHAPE

Practice Finds Regulars Passing and Shooting Very Erratically

Indulging in the usual practice game with the yearling quintet, the Varsity cagemen came out ahead in Wednesday's scrimmage at the Coliseum. The general play of the Varsity team was not so good as that of yesterday's exhibition when the Varsity defeated the freshmen 15 to 4. Passing was erratic at times and numerous set-up attempts at the baskets were not converted by the Varsity forwards.

The middle court at the Coliseum has been prepared for the Fireman's Ball which will be held there Wednesday evening so Coach Black took his basketeers to the third court for the scrimmage.

Lineup Changed
"Kenny" Othmer and Carl Olson, forwards; Glen Munn, center; George Gohde and "Lew" Lewandowski, guards made up the team in the Wednesday game. Munn played a good game at the pivot position and counted on numerous follow-in attempts. Lewandowski and Gohde worked well together at guard and the former accounted for several baskets.

As Saturday's contest with the Kansas Aggies approaches, Coach Black is concentrating his efforts on developing a new offensive system. Special efforts are being made to stop the Aggie attack and ring up the second victory of the season for the Blackmen.

Helm Has Injury
According to Coach Charley Black, his squad is in fine physical condition with the exception of Elmer Helm who has been troubled lately with a knee injury. No predictions for the Saturday game were forthcoming from the Husker basket coach.

Another scrimmage with the yearling hoopsters is on the schedule for this afternoon's program. Last night the freshmen lacked many of their main stars—Kimball, Fisher, Milhollin, Morrison—but displayed plenty of opposition to the Varsity men. Rogers, diminutive freshman, has been getting the call for one of the forward positions lately and, according to Coach Bunny Oakes, is developing fast.

Large crowds have been on hand for every home game this season. The next three games for Nebraska come on Saturday nights, Kansas Aggies, Jan. 21; Ames, Jan. 28, and Oklahoma A. & M., Feb. 4.

**SIX COMPANIES
COMPLETE MEET**

Records of Companies A, B, and C Completed; Company C Ranks Highest

Six companies have now completed the R. O. T. C. track meet. The complete records have been compiled on but three companies so far. Company C ranks the highest in the number of points with 2829 points. Company A ranks second so far with a total of 2155 points. Company B gathered a total of 2085 points. Jimmy Lewis has been working late these last few evenings to get all the material together for the total scores. Companies D, E, and F have completed the tryouts but the scores have not yet been compiled.

Company C has some fine performers in R. W. Andrews, R. E. Walna and C. H. Mosul. Andrews broadjumped 18 feet, threw the 32 pound weight 25 ft., 4 in., ran the high hurdles in 5.5 seconds, and ran

the lap race in 33.6 seconds. He was that company's outstanding performer.

J. S. Pierce was the outstanding athlete for Company B. He ran the low hurdles in 7.6, pole vaulted 8 feet, and broadjumped 18 feet and 10 inches. D. E. Thompson made good time in three events: broad jump 16 ft., 5 in., high hurdles 5 seconds, and the low hurdles 7.8.
