LUGHNA GIVES COLLECTION

University Museum Receives Iowa Fossil Corals

Dr. A. L. Luga had presented the University museum with a small collection of Silurian (Niagaran) fossil corals consisting of about a dozen different species in all. Four or five are rare and only recently described forms.

The collection was made near Monticello in Jones county, Iowa. This locality is famous as a collecting ground for Silurian corals, many and other corals almost equally rare have been found but one other place. A collection of Mississippi foswith a few other forms were also given to the museum by Dr. Luga.
