University Library Possesses Rare Book

Five hundred numbered and signed copies of this book were printed privately, of which 250 comprise the International Edition in French, German, Italian, Spanish, and Japanese. The copy owned by the University library is number 165, and it was purchased in the spring of 1922.

Miss Violet Oakley, who painted the murals shown in this book, was born in New Jersey, close to New York City. She comes from a fam-

ily of artists, her grandfather being artist of note.

She studied at the Art Students' League in New York, later with Carroll Beckwith and Irving R. Wiles. After studying art in Paris and London, Miss Oakley returned to America where she continued her studies at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Art and the Drexel Institute, both in Philadelphia.

Beginning her professional career with the illustrating of books and magazines and the designing of stained glass windows, Miss Oakley has steadily advanced until her work may be found in some of the most important buildings in the eastern part of the United States.

Other Works

Some of her better known works include "The Wise Virgins," a double window in St. Peter's church in Germantown, Pennsylvania, murals in Cuyahoga County Court House at Cleveland, Ohio, and murals in All Angels' church, New York.

Gilbert Doane, University librarian, says that books of this type offer more aid to the students of art, than is offered by the original paintings themselves, for the book may be taken into the classroom and studied minutely. On the other hand the originals are so high up on the ceiling of the rooms that contain them that the student has great difficulty in making a study of them. The book has special value to students at the University of Nebraska, for they do not even have the opportunity of studying the originals.

Several people who have seen this book on the murals of the Pennsylvania capitol have expressed the desire that a similar volume might be issued on the murals which the Nebraska capitol building is to possess.

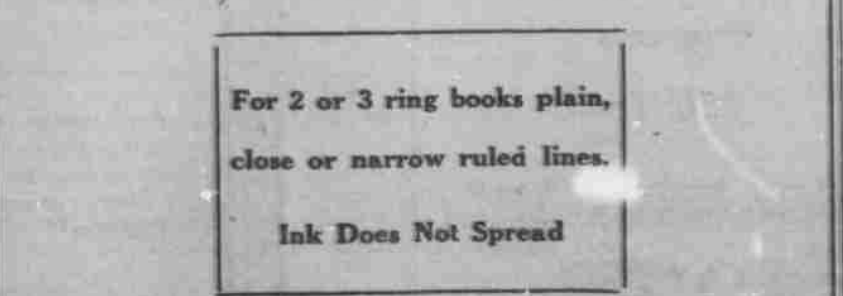
