METHODIST STUDENTS PLAN UNIQUE PARTY

University of Nebraska and Wesleyan Groups Set 'Pigskin' Program

Plans are all set for the joint "pigskin" party for all students of the University of Nebraska and Nebraska Wesleyan university to be held Friday night at 8 o'clock in the activities building on the agricultural college campus according to Rev. W. C. Fawell, university student pastor for Methodist students.

The program will feature the introduction of Coach Dana Bible of the University of Nebraska who will make a short talk on football of the past and present, and M. E. Gilbert, extension secretary of Nebraska Wesleyan.

Another feature on the program will be the representation of a preliminary clash between the Nebraska and Oklahoma football teams.

An open invitation is extended to all Methodist students of Nebraska and Nebraska Wesleyan universities. A charge of ten cents will be made to defray the expense of refreshments. An attendance of about 400 students from the University of Nebraska and about 200 from Wesleyan is expected.

CYCLONES PREPARE FOR DRAKE ATTACK

Iowa Pigskin Chasers Will Defend Honor at Home On Dad's Day

AMES, Ia.—The twenty-ninth football game between Iowa State and Drake, on State field next Saturday as a part of the Cyclone's Parent's day celebration, will see Coach Noel Workman's eleven struggling to maintain a record of never having been defeated by the Bulldogs on Cardinal and Gold turf. The teams have met twenty-eight times, the Cyclones winning twenty-one, losing six and tying one.

Previous to last year's 18-0 Drake victory, the Cyclones had won the annual battle four years in succession by scores of 7-0, 13-7, 7-6, and 10-0 in 1927, 1928, and 1924, respectively. All but two of the historic battles have been staged in Des Moines, the Bulldogs appearing on State field in 1924 and 1926.

Dummy scrimmage with the varsity drilling on defense against Drake plays occupied the Iowa State college football team last night. Coach Noel Workman indicated that in tonight's practice he

would strive to perfect a defense against the Bulldogs' aerial attack, which was highly responsible for the 18-0 defeat handed the Cyclones last year.
