

VARSITY DEFEAT FRESHMEN 41-14

Bob Young Makes Two Out of Three Touchdowns in Last Quarter Battle Between Yearlings, First String at Stadium Saturday.

Nebraska Cornhusker stock took a decided shoot towards the sky Saturday afternoon when the varsity romped on the yearlings, 41-14, in the annual Varsity-Freshman game. Approximately four thousand people paid their way into the stadium, proceeds from the game going to the band fund. The R. O. T. C. band was present and played during the game, in two yearling touchdowns. Murray, former Omaha Tech star and White of Kimball were men from other schools who took their share of the freshman glory. The Browne coached team showed more polish and strength than has any freshman team in years and should give a pretty good account of themselves in their games this year.

Nebraska coaches had lost their worried look Saturday after the game and are really beginning to believe that the squad will develop into something. The team play is still ragged in spots but the work of the line Saturday afternoon was better than at any other time this year. Blocking and passing were both improved, these two departments being considered as the weakest. The large number of varsity penalties for holding caused a little discussion as this sort of penalties are pretty expensive in a big game.

Minor Injuries. Paul, Kroger and Rhea were all suffering from minor injuries and were not in the game for very long, although Line Coach Bunny Oakes was sure they would all be in shape for the opening game of the season next Saturday against the Texas Aggies. Frahm, Hokuf, Long, Young and Kreizinger accounted for the touchdowns. The Husker passing attack looked really polished Saturday afternoon with Young, Long and Rowley all heaving the ball. A long heave Young to Pruca placed the varsity in position for their first score and another pass, Young to Hokuf accounted for the second tally. Rowley and Long also had good luck with their tosses, the varsity completing more passes in the game than they have in all of the work outs so far this year.

Wally Marrow, Greenberg, Justice and Campbell all looked better than they have in previous games this season. Marrow has been a little slow in getting started but snaggd one of Long's passes for the feature catch of the afternoon. Greenberg and Justice at guards and Campbell at center served notice that they will have to be considered when Bible thinks of a starting lineup for the opening game.
