"FOR FAIR VIRGINIA."

In the drama "For Fair Virginia," which Manager Dowden has secured for the closing night of the present season at the Lansing, our theater-goers may confidently expect to find a play of more than usual merit and interest. No American play of recent years has met with more general favor, and a record of over 450 performances speaks volumes for its enduring worth. "For Fair Virginia" has been slow in reaching us, but this is due to the ever, be none the less welcome because of fact that it has been acted continuously the delay, and in the interval, curiosity and desire to see Mr. Russ Whytal's work have grown apace. The country has had of late rather an excess of lighter plays and farces and a thoroughly pure and wholesome play will, doubtless, be a welcome and agreeable change. "For Fair Virginia" deals with domestic life in the Old Dominion during war times. It is not what is generally understood as a "war play," with horrors of battles and wounds and dying heroes, but tells two charming love stories which are alternately interrupted or aided by the events of the war. The woman's side of the great struggle is shown; her sufferings, privations and heroism. Yet the general tone of the piece is not by any means gloomy. Mrs. Whytal appears in a light comedy character, while Mr. Whytal plays the heavy part, and there are several humorous roles. Mr. Whytal is an actor of long experience with the best stock companies and stars, Mrs. Whytal as Marie Knowles in the support of Rhea and Julia Marlowe may be remembered. She is a woman of marked charm of face and manner, and an actress of strikingly individual and original methods. There is nothing "stagey" or conventional about her acting. By many of the ablest critics she is said to suggest "a younger and more attractive Mrs. Kendall." Another very interesting figure in the piece is the child Julian, played by little Lottie Briscoe, one of the most attractive and most natural juvenile actresses. Her character is very important in the development of the story and she invariably establishes herself as a great favorite with the audience, especially with the ladies and children. Others in the company are Mabel Bert, who is well known here; Frank Doane, George F. Farren, John Woodward, John Borden and William Hopper.
