The Chicago University comedy club recently gave two performances of "The Deceitful Dean," a strictly university drama. The proceeds, about \$2,000 were given to the University settlement fund.

At the fencing tournament, held a short time ago, at the Fencers' club in New York, for the championship of the Amateur Fencers' league, the Harvard team, composed of G. H. Breed, A. B. Lapsley and M. Green, was victorious, with 56 points. The names of the other teams and the number of points made by them are as follows: B. A. A., 30; New York A. C., 27; Fencers' club, 11; Columbia, 5; Cornell, 3.

The delegates from the various debating societies at Yale have organized what is called the Yale Debating association. The object of this committee is to manage intercollegiate and interclub debates, and to exercise a general supervision over debating interest of the university. The officers have been elected as follows: President, E. B. Boise, '99; vice president, C. P. Kitchel, L. S.; secretary, A. D. Leavitt, '99; treasurer, E. W. Ong, '96. Representatives from Yale, Princeton, Pennsylvania, Cornell and Columbia met Monday at Havemyer hall, Columbia university, and formed a cross-country association, to be known as the Intercollegiate Cross-Country association of Amateur Athletes of America. A constitution was adopted and general plans talked over for the coming year. The new association will hold its first annual meet this fall, to which meet each of the above universities will send a team.

Of the 222 members in the faculty of the University of Michigan, 16 have taken upon examination, the degree of doctor of philosophy. Fourteen won the degree at the University of Michigan five at Cornell, four at Johns Hopkins, four at Harvard, and one each at Chicago, Yale, and Allegheny College. Nine took all of their academic degrees at a single institution, namely, seven at Michigan and one each at Harvard and Johns Hopkins. Sixteen received the doctors degree at foreign universities—five at Leipzig, two at Jena, and one each at Freiburg in Baden, Bonn, Glasgow, Munich, Vienna, Marburg, Berne, Zurich and Berlin.
