Intercollegiate Field Day.

The Intercollegiate Field day exercises between Doane, Wesleyan and the University track teams was held on the campus Saturday p. m. May 15. The weather was fine and each college was represented by a good crowd. A new 350 yard track was made for the occasion and the time of the races was much better than that made on the Uni. Field day. There were two University records broken and one tied. Benedict broke his record of 8 ft. 8½ in. on the pole vault, vaulting 9 ft. Robt. Andreson beat the record in the 220 yd. dash by 2.5 seconds. His time was 23.25 seconds. Wilbur Andreson tied his record in the high jump of 5 ft. 4½ in. The first

event was the shot put. Won by Bohr, Doane, 31 ft. Lee, Doane, second. Hansen third.

The second event was the 190 yd. dash, R. D. Andreson first, time 10.45. Cunningham, Wesleyan, second. The hammer throw was won by Carver of Wesleyan, 80 ft. 7 in. being his throw. Hancock, Wesleyan, second, Lee of Doane, third. W. E. Anderson won the high jump, Kyle Nebraska, second. The 220 yard dash was won by Robt. Andreson, time 23.25 seconds. Cunningham of Wesleyan second. The standing broad jump was won by Moore of Wesleyan, 9 ft. 3¼ in. Lee of Doane, second. The 880 yd. run was won by Noyce of Doane, time 2.14½. Leonard of Wesleyan, second. Benedict won the running hop, step and jump, establishing a university record of 41 ft. 9 in., Moore, Wesleyan, second. Reed of Doane, third. Benedict also got first on the pole vault. The vault was 9 ft. Ellis, Doane, second.

The 440 yard run was won by Robt. Andreson, time 54.45 seconds. Ellis, Doane, second. Running broad jump was won by Wilbur Andreson, 18 ft. 8 in. Benedict 18 ft. 6 in. second, and Olson of Wesleyan third. The 120 yard hurdle race was won by Patten of Doane in 21.35 seconds; Wilbur Andreson second. Priestly, Wesleyan, third. The mile run was won by Noyce of Doane, time 5:7. Leonard, Wesleyan second. First place in an event counted 5 points, second, 3 points and third, 1 point. The judges were Green, Pound and Raley. They gave the university 50 points, Doane 35 and Wesleyan 32. Nebraska had the smallest team which left a great deal to be accomplished by a few. The two Andresons and Benedict made 41 of the 50 points.
