Mechanic Arts Building.

The foundation for one wing of the new building will be laid this fall. The appropriation of \$30,000 by the last legislature is not sufficient to build a suitable building for this department so the "powers" have decided to build by piece meal. The back wing, to stand opposite eleventh street between the Boiler House and Nebraska Hall, will be built next year in time to be occupied when school work begins in the fall.

The building will be plain and substantial, built of brick with stone trimmings. Though not fire proof it will be of the slow burning type. It is to be three stories high not including the attic. The complete building with furnishings will cost about \$85,000.

The basement or first story will contain the machine shops and foundry for practical mechanics, several laboratories for electrical work and a testing laboratory for work in civil engineering.

The second story will contain a mechanical museum, lecture rooms and offices for professors. The third floor will contain several lecture rooms one of which will accommodate two hundred students. The half story is to be fitted for sketching and drawing rooms. The building will be well lighted and heated, besides containing the best of ventilating apparatus.
