A portrait of Judge S. B. Pound, formerly vice president of the state historical society, has recently been received at the society's rooms.

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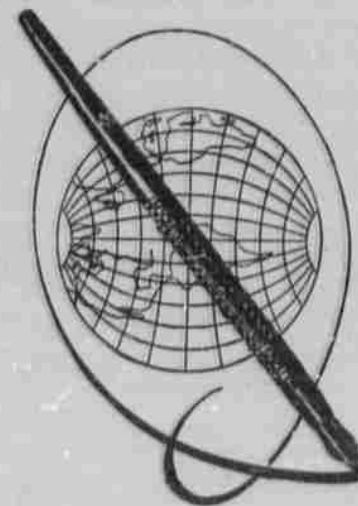
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
