**THE MILITARY DEPARTMENT.**  
Drill will begin as usual as soon as registration is finished. Setting up exercises will be the order of the day for several weeks. A large increase in numbers is expected and it may be necessary to organize the men into two battalions. The old style of uniforms will be retained this year instead of adopting the uniform of the national guard as was at first proposed. Commandant Allen La Rue Brown's work last year was greatly commended by the United States inspector. A well drilled battalion may be looked for this year.

A special effort will be made to organize companies in cavalry and artillery.

The Pershing rifles will be reorganized this year and will be made up of the best drilled men in the battalion.

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
