

as truly an agricultural crop as wheat or corn. With the Division of Forestry investigating the best methods of tree culture and offering its advice and assistance to landowners interested in tree-planting, there is reason to believe that in the near future much headway will be made in bringing about a reasonable forest growth on lands now almost treeless.

The work outlined by the Division, looking to the improvement of Nebraska forests, should attract general attention, considering that throughout this region forest products are in constant demand, commanding high prices and presenting a profitable field for the investment of capital. Improved forest conditions in Nebraska would mean cheaper fuel, a beneficial influence on local climate, with a consequent increase in the value of land.

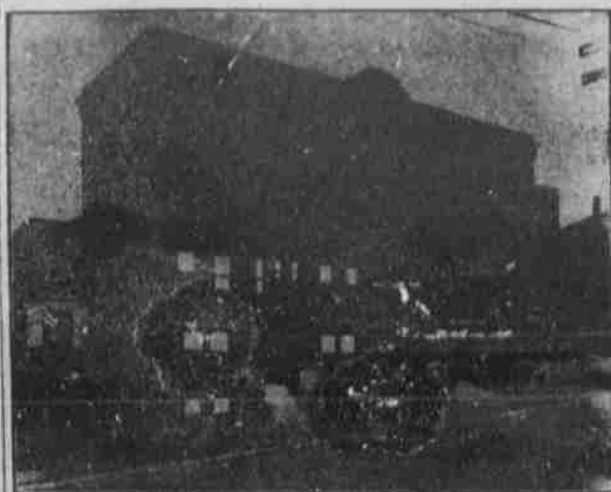
