The return of the ball team calls to mind the good record made by the players on the trip. Fourteen games were played, out of which Nebraska won nine, one of the games lost being to a professional team in Indiana. A better record could hardly be hoped for. The team had the disadvantage of playing away from home and long, hard trips between games. However, the pennant of the western colleges comes to Nebraska. We defeated Iowa in one game, in which the result was at no time in doubt. Missouri was defeated in four one-sided games, and Kansas in two. The record is surely one to be proud of, being one of the best ever made by a Nebraska team. From a financial standpoint the trip was equally successful, the manager being able to hand over about seventy-five dollars to the athletic board.

The election of the officers of the debating association, which occurred Saturday, proved to be a warm con-

test. However, the results seem most satisfactory to every one, and the association now seems to have settled all the old difficulties. George A. Lee, the new president, is a young man in the university, being a member of the class of 1903. He first obtained prominence in debating only this year by winning the position of alternate in the finals. Every one remembers his recent part in the Missouri debate. Mr. Lee will no doubt prove an efficient and just presiding officer, as well as an energetic worker for the interstate contests. The battle cry of the debaters for next year should be "Leland Stanford and Minnesota."
