

tion shall be turned over to the treasurer.

Sec. 4. The treasurer shall keep a complete set of books showing all the transactions of the corporation. He shall receive all moneys collected for the corporation and shall pay all bills. His books shall at all times be open to the inspection of the board of directors, who shall audit them and report to the annual meeting of the stockholders the condition of the business at the close of each year.

Sec. 5. Whatever profits shall accrue over and above such a sum as the board of directors shall deem necessary to hold in reserve shall be placed at the disposal of the board of regents of the University of Nebraska.
