UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA,

The University of the State was opened for
 the second year September 12, 1872, under favora-
 ble conditions, and thus far has been prosperous
 and successful.
PROFESSORS.
 The Faculty, at present, is composed of seven
 Professors, skilled in their several departments
 of instruction.

ADMISSION.
 Students of both sexes are admitted to the
 University on passing examination in the com-
 mon English branches, if entering the Latin
 School; or in studies of advanced classes, if
 claiming an advanced standing.

TUITION.
 Tuition in all departments is FREE. There is
 an entrance fee of \$5. Books are furnished at
 cost.
APPARATUS, ETC.
 The Institution is liberally supplied with Ap-
 paratus, Cabinet, Library, and all needful facili-
 ties for illustrating the subjects taught. The
 Philosophical and Chemical Apparatus is espe-
 cially large and valuable.

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE.
 The Agricultural College is now open, and fur-
 nishes a full course of instruction running
 through four years, or a partial course in prac-
 tical agriculture, requiring one year. The com-
 pletion of the full course entitles the student to
 a degree.

BOARDING.
 Boarding is obtained at reasonable rates in pri-
 vate families, or by renting rooms the expense
 may be reduced to \$3 or \$4 per week. At present
 boarding in families is from \$4 to \$5 per week.
CALENDAR.
 The Fall Term began Thursday, September 12.
 The Winter Term will begin Thursday, Janu-
 ary 2, 1873.
