Your attention is called to A NEW AND NOVEL SCHEME OF EASY PAYMENTS, or a system of renting with privilege of purchase. The person taking the organ hires it for not less than six months, paying rent, equal to ten per cent. of the value of the organ, quarterly in advance; and having all rent paid allowed toward the purchase of the instrument, which he may complete at any time. By paying rent for ten quarters the organ becomes the property of the party hiring. On any payment made before it becomes due, a deduction is allowed, at the rate of ten per cent. per annum, for the time anticipated.

The person hiring can, at any time after six months, return the organ without further payment than the reasonable rent, which will already have been paid for the time it has been in use.

Pianos are furnished upon like terms; the payment being one-fifth for six months, and semi-annually thereafter. This gives the purchaser an opportunity to thoroughly test the instrument. This plan gives two and a half years' trial; and every instrument fully warranted.
