And wipes a tear away.

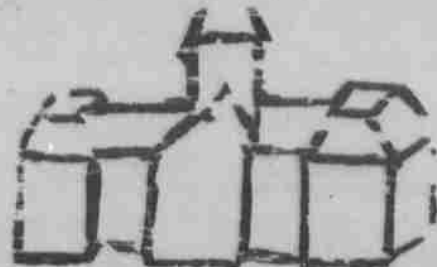
No more he walks with stately tread
