Brown Bread Recipe.

A Rhode Island housewife contributes this recipe to Good Housekeeping:

Three half pint cupfuls of Indian cornmeal, same of rye meal, one-half or two-thirds cupful of molasses, according to taste, sour milk enough to mix—it will depend somewhat upon the kind of meal and the consistency of the milk. It will be better if the milk is solid "bounyclabber" and will probably take about 2 cupfuls, half a teaspoonful of saleratus stirred in the milk and a little salt. Steam four hours, taking care not to let the water stop boiling. Set in the oven to form a top crust, if liked. Use no sweet milk.
