CARSON-David Carson and Jean (Oliver) Carson were of Scotch ancestry, but both born in the North of Ireland, he in 1750, she in 1760. In 1784 he emigrated to America and immediately settled in Greencastle, Penna. He afterward visited Ireland, and on July 28, 1788, there married Jean Oliver. The same year he returned with his bride to Newcastle, where both continued to reside untill death. She was the great grand-daughter of John White, an Englishman, who came to this country about 1725, and settled in New Jersey, Her grand-father, Peter White, settled in Washington (then Frederick) county, Maryland, and took up a large tract of land, situated on both banks of the now historic Antietam creek. There he married Margaret Stull, by whom he had eight children. Their fourth son, John White was a soldier in the war of the Revolution, and the father of Rosanna Marshall White. He married Ellen Williams, who was of Welsh ancestry, and settled in the Ligonier valley, Westmorland county, Penna., where Posanna Marshall White was born, May, 2 1791. She died at Mercersburg on September 24. 1879. Their children were, Ebenezer Erskin, Davin, Ellen Jane, Elizabeth Erskin, James White and John Lind. John Lind Carson was born at Mercersburg August 30, 1832, and married Miss Mary Masters Ruly. H. C. Townsend, F. D. CORNELL, He settled in Nebraska in 1856, where he established the first banking house in the (then) territory, and has since resided and been engaged in banking.

STUART-Donald Stuart emigrated from Scotland during the early part of the eighteenth century, and settled in Rowley, Essex county, Mass., where he died when nearly one hundred years of age. One of his descendants, Charles Stuart, was born in Sterling, and there spent the whole eighty four years of his life. He was farmer by occupation, and married Miss Elizabeth Moore, who bore him several children. Their son, Levi, was also born, reared, married, and died at Sterling. He died in the early part of the year 1875, his wife, Jane Ames, having died twenty years before 1855. Their children were Alexander, Ambrose P. S., Susan, Addison, Eliza, Addison A., Marietta, Washington, and Charles Wesley.
