Joe Flynn "McGinty the Sport," was the only attraction in the theatrical line at the theatres this week. Mr. Flynn's popularity as the author of "Down Went McGinty" has been gradually dying out lately, but those who remember him and the famous song, turned out Tuesday evening and helped make a very large and appreciative audience at his first appearance in Lincoln. "McGinty the Sport" is a farce comedy of an unusually high order. With the exception of two or three well acted but somewhat repulsive parts in the play, or rather the singing and dancing, was brilliant and sparkling, as the advance notices say. But like nearly all farce comedies of this sort there were parts so out of harmony with their surroundings that they detracted much from the otherwise exceptionally meritorious work. Mr. Flynn as the "Sport" was a very good looking, well dressed and well mannered fellow, but his associate and partner in business was just the opposite. His acting was clever at times, but the part a trifle vulgar, contrasted with the dignified and stately McGinty.
