Mr. George W. Smalley, for example, has contributed to the August Harper's a most readable paper of anecdotes, d upon personal experiences with Mr. Gladstone, which throws a strong and, in many respects, a new light upon the character and traits of the eminent statesman. Lord Rosebery once said that Mr. Gladstone's life could only be written by a limited liability company. Mr. Smalley has made no attempt to write his life, but he has furnished much valuable material for a possible biographer. This reminiscent article is to be followed in a subsequent issue of the same magazine by Mr Mr. Smalley's estimate of the character and career of the great prime minister.


