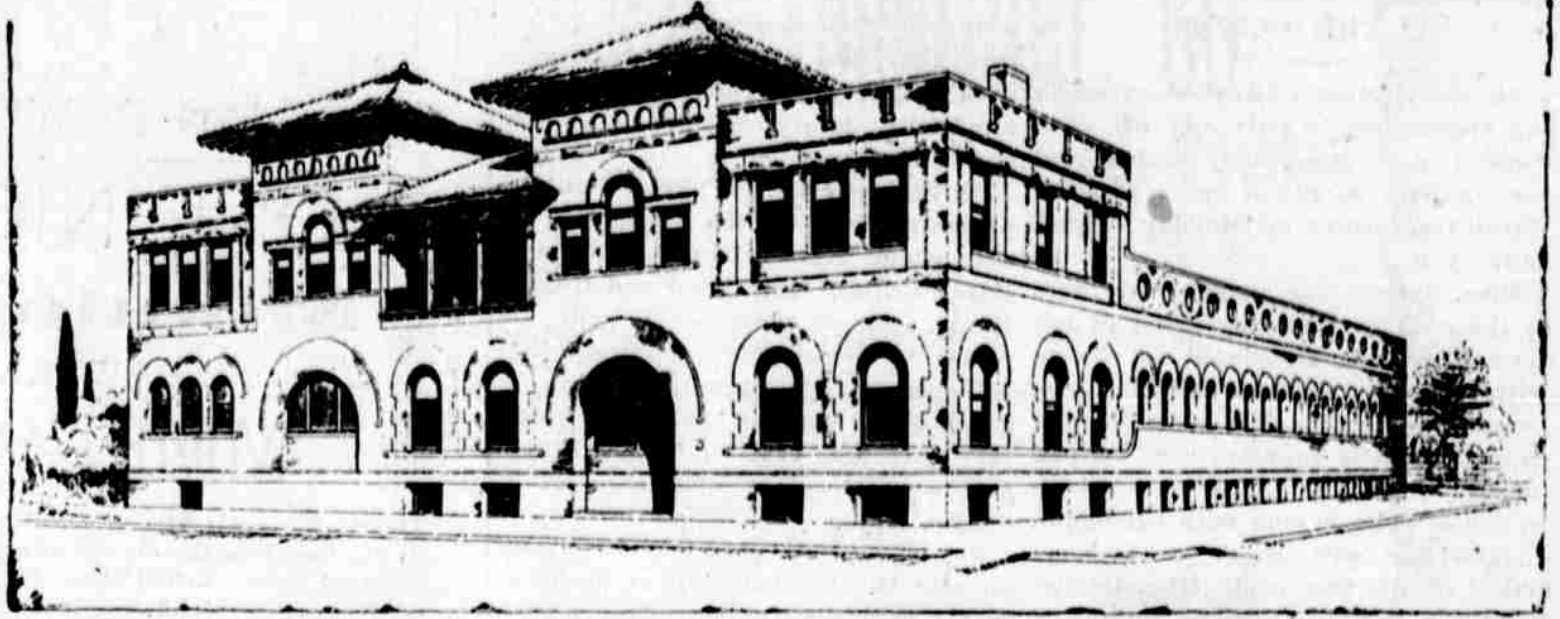


THE THEATRE
