

TRAVELING LIBRARIES.

An earnest effort is being made during the present session of the legislature secure the passage of a bill establishing in Nebraska a system of traveling libraries, similar to that which is now in successful operation in many other states. Such a bill known as House Roll 206 has been introduced and recommended for passage by the house committee on libraries and there is reason to believe that it will meet with favorable action. This will, if it becomes a law, mean a great deal to the women's clubs in Nebraska.

It will supplement the system of traveling libraries which have been operated for four years by the State federation and which has so often been unable to supply the demand for books needed in the work in smaller communities. The N. F. W. C. has blazed the way for the new bill and the sentiment which the Federation libraries has created is now asking that the state take up the matter and offer to its people who are remote from reading privileges good books. The women's clubs will, in the nature of things be large users of traveling libraries and it is hoped that the 3500 club women in Nebraska will spare no effort to bring this matter to the favorable notice of their members of the legislature and to urge upon them the hearty support of so distinctly an educational measure designed to reach the thousands of our people who have practically no opportunities for good and free reading such as one afforded in the cities by the free public libraries.

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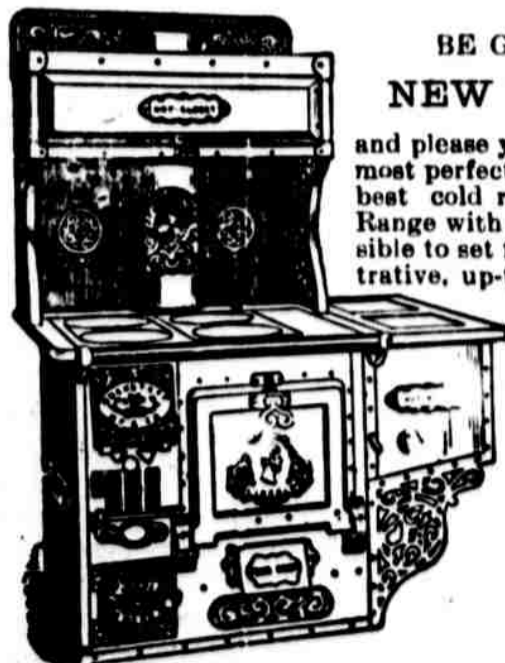
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
