Reductions in John Bull's Postal Rates.

Among the reductions in rates in the
British postal service proposed by
Henniker Heaton, M. P., is one providing
for the sale of postal cards at their
face, or stamp, value, the cards to be
increased in size to the standard of the
postal union. Another calls for the
reduction of the registration fee to one
penny (two cents), and still another
refers to the telegraph rates, the telegraph
being under the control of the
postoffice in England. It provides that
the name and address of the sender of
a message shall be free, or a charge
made of twelve cents for twenty
words.
