lish in the public schools of Ligcoln I regret that I have seemed to under-rate the services of the present school board. The board as a whole is composed of scholariy men with a single mind to the interests of the schools. The system of education in use at the present time does not educate ninety-eight per cent of the pupils. It is not exacting to demand that the half a million dollars which eight years' maintenance of the grades costs this city should prepare the children fairly well for life, that it should furnish them a working knowledge of English.
