Resolved, That we encourage all advanced steps for the elevation and sustenance of women, and especially patronize the places where they are given employment; and be it

Resolved, That the Federation of Southern Colored Women will do whatever we can to encourage the patronage of all the race enterprises.

Whereas, We realize that the ranks of the criminal classes are being constantly filled with the youth of our race, who have no early moral training; and,

Whereas, We do feel that by organized effort on the part of our women for the carrying out of successful and approved plans for training children, be it

Resolved, That this body do recommend that such work be undertaken through kindergarten schools, in all places where clubs exist.

Resolved, further, That a central committee be appointed, consisting of one member from each southern state, who will take the work in charge.
