POPULAR LINCOLN RECTOR



JAMES M. J. READE. Descendant of Colonial Family-Rector of St. Theresa's Pro-Cathedral.

Rev. James M. J. Reade

Reverend James M. J. Reade, rector at St. Theresa's pro-cathedral, (Catholic) has been a resident of Lincoln for the past three years. He is fortyeight years of age and belongs to the Cole-Reade family of Rhode Island. which extends back far into the prerevolutionary days.

Two of the ancestors of Rev. Father Reade were signers of the declaration of independence. One was a member of the Cole family and the other was Colonel Reade, celebrated in the historical annals of Rhode Island.

Father Reade studied in New York, Boston, Montreal and several other cities in the east and in Canada. His first work in the religious field was as missionary among the Arapahoes in Wyoming. Here he remained for several years. Afterwards he was professor in a theological seminary and finally resumed his church work again. For a time he had a congregation in New York city and was compelled to come west on account of failing health. Since arriving in Lincoln he has had charge of the work at St. Theresa's, Father Reade has won the admiration and affection of his parishioners since beginning his labors in the Capital
