RICHARD L. METCALFE

Friends of many hundreds and the keen appreciation of thousands more were voiced in many phrases by eloquent tongues that spoke Thursday evening at the banquet tendered at the Paxton to Richard L. Metcalfe, editor of the World-Herald.

It was the farewell dinner given Mr. Metcalfe in recognition of his departures from Omaha to become a resident of Lincoln, where he takes the position of associate editor of The Commoner, with W. J. Bryan, leaving the World-Herald, of which he has been the editor for the past ten years, and with which he has been connected since 1888.

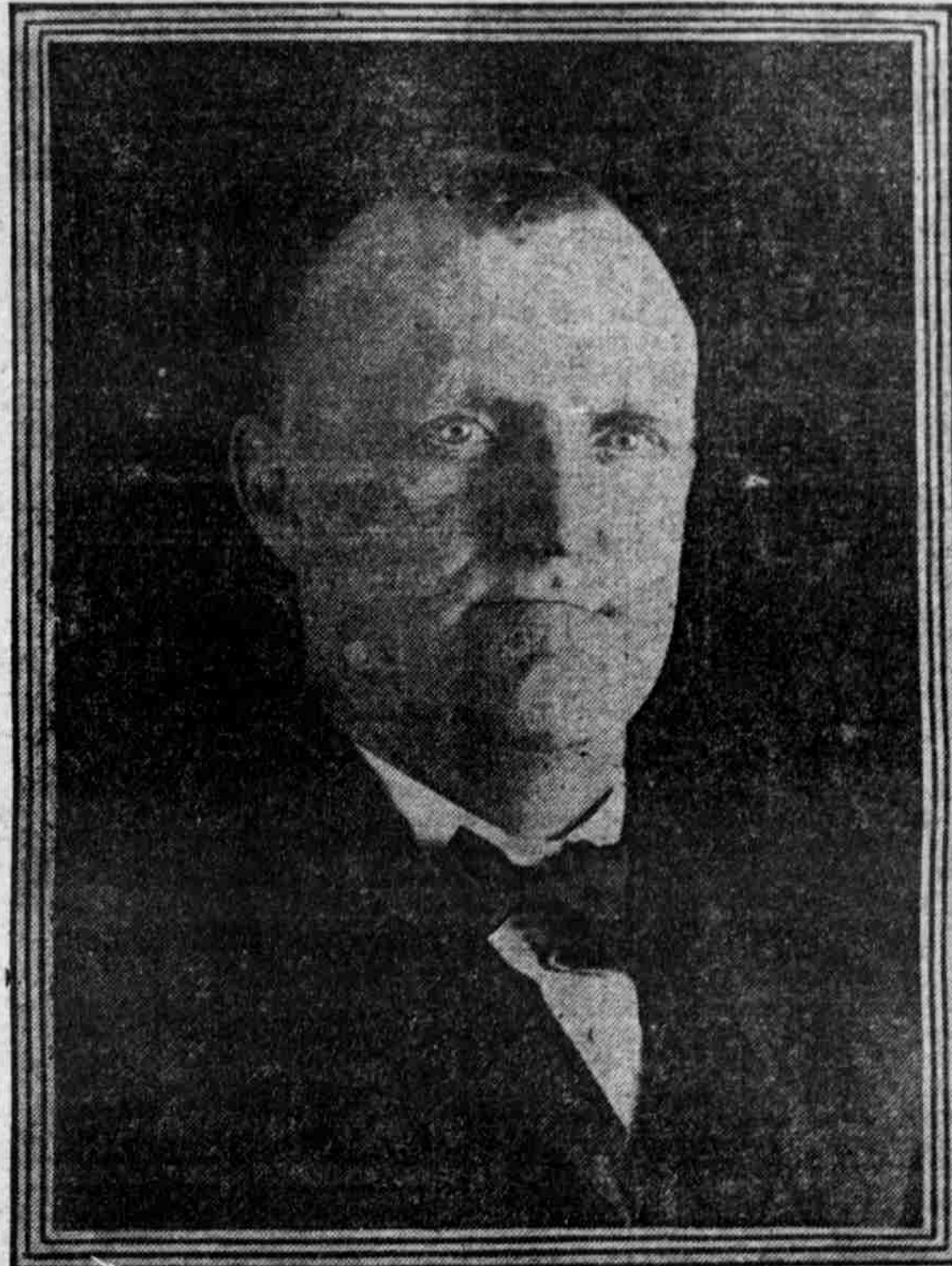
It was at once the most representative and the most cosmopolitan ban-

binding the cards bore the words, "Metcalfe—Goodbye."

It was 9 o'clock when the guests were seated at the long tables that filled the great dining hall, and it was five hours later when the speeches of those who were called upon were concluded.

C. J. Symth presided as toastmaster, and those who spoke were Rev. John Williams, Samuel Rees, General C. H. Manderson, Edward Rosewater, T. J. Mahoney, E. A. Benson, R. C. Craven, Rev. P. F. McCarthy, William Kennedy, I. J. Dunn, G. M. Hitchcock, T. J. Nolan and Mr. Metcalfe.

Many and beautiful were the tributes paid to the honored guest, and

quet ever tendered in this city. Covers were laid for 150, and it was necessary at the last moment to make additional arrangements for unexpected guests. The genuineness of the prevailing atmosphere was frequently remarked, and there was constantly in evidence a sense of personal loss that could not be concealed.

There was an utter absence of partisanship or politics, and the occasion was devoted wholly to the expression of appreciation of the work that Mr. Metcalfe has done in a newspaper capacity, and of the esteem in which he has been held by his fellows as a man.

The sentiment of the evening was well expressed by the words on the beautiful gold watch presented to him:

Presented to Richard L. Metcalfe, by the citizens of Omaha in token of their appreciation of his ability as an editor, and of their high regard for him as a man. April 27, 1905.

The menu cards were exceptionally neat affairs and bore on the reverse cover a picture of Mr. Metcalfe taken when 8 years of age. The ribbons

of the assemblage testified its entire approval of the sentiments expressed by spontaneous and insistent applause.

The toastmaster introduced the post-prandial portion of the program after a two-hour discussion of an elaborate menu. He said:

No Differences Here

"If it is fortunate that we are not agreed on everything, it is equally fortunate that we are agreed on some things. We differ as to the best policy to be pursued by the government; whether a protective tariff is wise or unwise; whether gold alone or gold and silver should constitute the standard of value; whether railroad rates should be regulated by the people or by the railroads themselves—in fact, some here are known to differ as to which route leads to eternal happiness, and I have no doubt that we would have no difficulty tonight in eliciting a vigorous polemical discussion between some of the gentlemen whose names grace our toast list.

"But whatever our differences may be with respect to such matters, we are all united in deepest respect for the man who never deserts a friend or fails to find joy in the laughter of lit-
