DISCRIMINATING

The jury in the licorice trust case returned a verdict of guilty against the two corporations, convicting these concerns of forming an illegal combination; at the same time this jury gave a verdict of acquittal to the presidents of these corporations. The New York World pays its respects to the jurors in this way: "The wonder is that so discriminating a lot of jurors failed to see the logic of attributing criminal intent to the rubber stamps or typewriters used in signing and writing corporation communications. The moral obliquity of inanimate things calls for instant correction for the security of the corporations' business."
