SENATE'S LAST CRY "NO RATIFI-CATION"

On account of the failure of Governor Neville to include ratification of the national prohibitory amendment in his call for a special session, and also on account of the refusal of the senate to consider that subject, the federal amendment must await the action of the next regular session of the legislature, or some subsequent session. The house of representatives ratified the prohibitory amendment, regardless of the governor's refusal to place that subject in his call, but the senate repeatedly refused to consider this subject.

Had it not been for a resolution by Senator A. J. Sawyer of Lancaster the special session might have adjourned without passing a resolution commending President Wilson and the war. As the senate had previously shut out consideration of the joint resolutions, for fear ratification of prohibition would go through, the Sawyer resolution on the war had to be adopted as a sep-
