

Huskers score 15 times

Varsity nets 8 tallies on frosh; 7 among 'selves

Practice produces smiles on Biffer's face; passes, long runs brighten drill

Eight touchdowns against the freshmen just were not enough for Coach Biff Jones, Saturday afternoon he had to work his varsity overtime. The dividends paid off, producing seven more scores in an intrasquad skirmish.

Nobody in particular had a field day, but all varsity performers were riding high as the total results show. Here's a score-by-score account against the frosh:

No. 1. Harry Hopp ran the opening kickoff back 95 yards.

Passes net 2 scores.

No. 2. On the very next play, Hopp passed to Mike Francis for a 70 yard counter.

No. 3. Two plays later, Hopp passed to Butch Luther for a 35 yard marker.

No. 4. Luther traveled 35 yards on a reverse.

No. 5. Hopp returned a punt 70 yards.

No. 6. The second varsity entered the game and Bus Knight scored from the 18 after a 60 yard march.

No. 7. Herman Rohrig flipped a scoring pass to Knight.

No. 8. Rohrig returned a punt 70 yards for the final score against the frosh. (Assistant

Freshman Coach Harold Petz then withdrew his yearlings to the frosh practice field for more even competition—among themselves.)

Hopp scores 3 more.

In the intrasquad scrimmage, the first eleven did the greater share of scoring. The following seven short paragraphs sum up the remainder of the touchdown parade:

No. 9. After a 50 yard march, Francis plunged over from the 2—a score on the thirds.

No. 10. Hopp raced 41 yards against the second team.

No. 11. Another march ended with Hopp blasting over from the 3.

No. 12. The thirds carried the mail against the seconds as Bob Ludwig took a short pass from Dale Bradley and ran 30 yards to score. Henry Rohn placekicked an extra point.

Zikmund scores on pass.

No. 13. Rohrig tossed to Allen Zikmund for a 70 yard touchdown gain. Rohrig made the added point from placement.

No. 14. The first team made its last score against the fourth as Hopp plunged the final 3 yards. Hastings Harry added the extra point by placement.

No. 15. The second team chalked up the final counter as Wayne Blue knifed thru the fourth eleven for 2 yards.

Outside of the actual scoring plays, the varsity spent much of its time perfecting the running order of the attack. The Biffer had smile upon smile on his face after a few of the choice plays worked out for long gains.

Warren Alfson, winner guard, was on the sidelines with a bad ankle, but was in suit. Bob Bur-

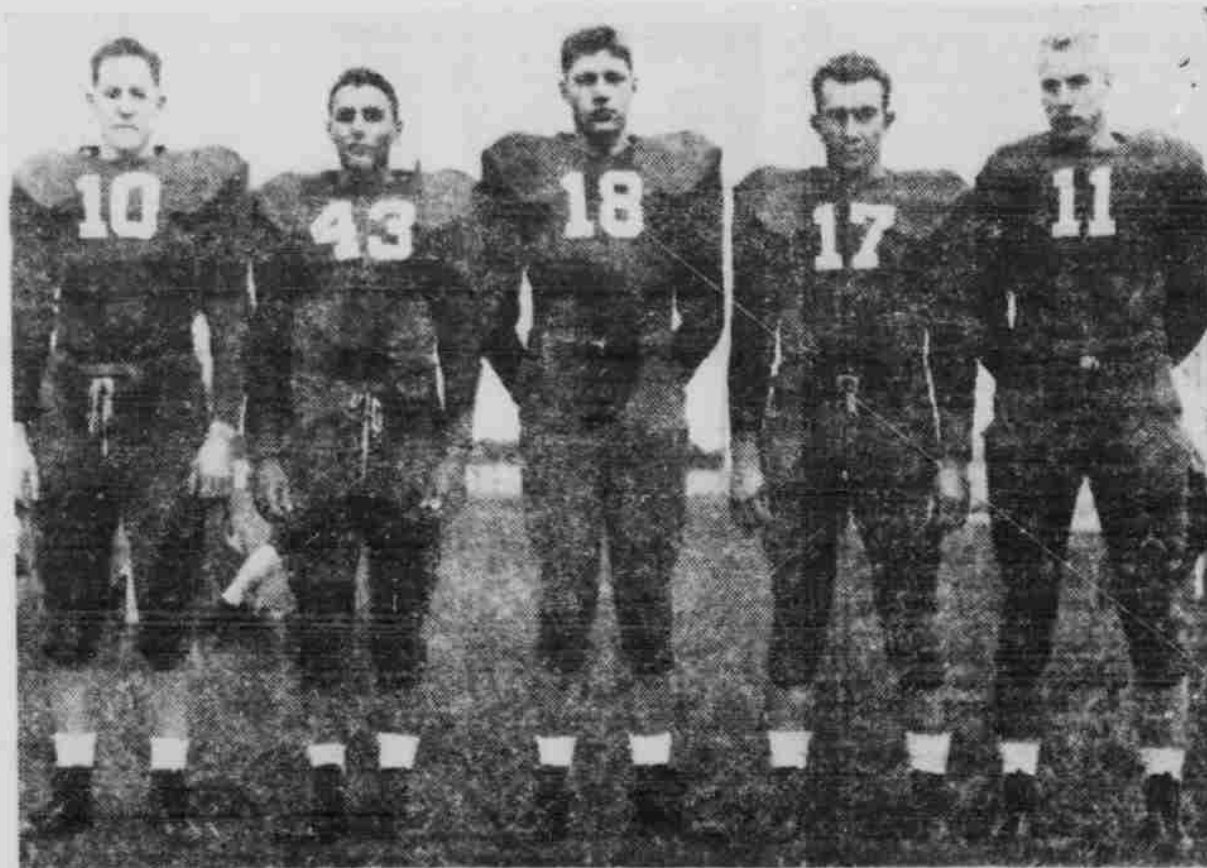
