university may apply for a special examination to obtain credit which, if granted, requires payment of regular fees.

Not grounds for deferment.

Enrollment in the courses is not considered grounds for deferment from selective service and no jobs are guaranteed. On the other hand students will not be required to take any particular jobs after completing the courses.

Applications for the courses must be in May 24, at which time selections will be made, if the number of applicants exceed the number that can be handled. A personal interview will be arranged for applicants and a physical examination will be required for those taking the daytime course in drafting and shop practice.
