. . . May Come Under Point System

Because of the small response received from the first announcement, Pat Lahr union social director has issued the second call for volunteers to work with the eight student members of the board of directors on the following

activity committees in the union dances, hospitality, convocations, house rules, music, competitive games, general entertainment, publicity.

"Eventually," stated Miss Lahr, "we hope that this committee work will be considered as important as any other board position or publication staff job."

This is a new opening for persons interested in activities and the AWS board co-operating with the men's point board will establish a system of points that can be earned by persons receiving appointments on the committees.

Freshmen May Apply.

Five to fifteen positions are open in each division and freshmen as well as upper classmen are urged to apply at the union office immediately and state their preference as to committee work.

The publicity committee will arrange for the distribution of signs and make arrangements for speaking tours, while the convocation committee will contact the union speakers, have charge of the speakers during their visit in Lincoln, and arrange the student forums.

A file of the union activity workers will be kept and recommendations will be issued from this for persons seeking permanent positions in the future.
