

Eveland's goal is to hit 70 per cent of field goals

Fans in Memorial Stadium often boo when senior Al Eveland steps on the field to attempt a field goal, but he said he understands why.

"You know what they want," he said. "They want the six points."

Eveland said when coach Tom Osborne elects to go for a touchdown or a first down instead of a field goal, it doesn't make any difference to him, adding that he is ready if needed.

Eveland leads the Huskers in scoring with 56 points, and until last week, he also led Big 8 Conference scoring. Eveland now is third in the Big 8 individual scoring race behind Terry Miller of Oklahoma State University and Jim Kelleher of The University of Colorado.

"Leading the Big 8 in scoring is not one of my goals," Eveland said. "My goal is to not miss any more PAT's

(points after touchdowns) the rest of the season and to hit 70 per cent of my field goals. I think I can consistently hit 40- to 45-yard field goals."

Eveland has connected on 26 of 28 extra point attempts and 10 of 15 field goals this season.

Eveland said he has improved since the Huskers' first game this season against Louisiana State University (LSU). In that game, Eveland missed a 34-yard field goal, had a 39-yarder blocked and missed UNL's only PAT attempt. Eveland received criticism after the 6-6 tie with LSU, but he said that criticism has helped him.

"If anything, it probably did me good," he said. "I wasn't doing all that well. It made me work harder and concentrate more. I lacked confidence at that point in the season."

The past two games sophomore Ron Vandemeer has

shared kick-off duties with him, but Eveland said it is for a good reason.

"Ron gets the ball up higher," he said. "Most kickers try to get about four seconds hang time, but Ron gets about five seconds."

Eveland said he is more consistent this year. The biggest problem he has had is with his placement team.

"Changing the rhythm between holders and centers is a problem, but I'm getting used to the ones I have now (center Tom Davis and quarterback Vince Ferragamo).

Hawks, Harper 10 A, Sigma Chi A at top of intramural football ratings

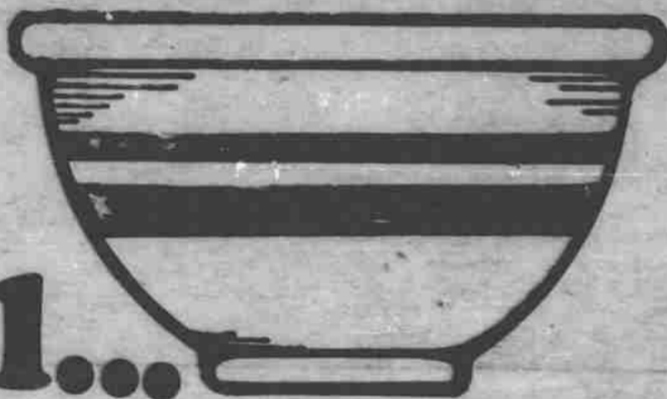

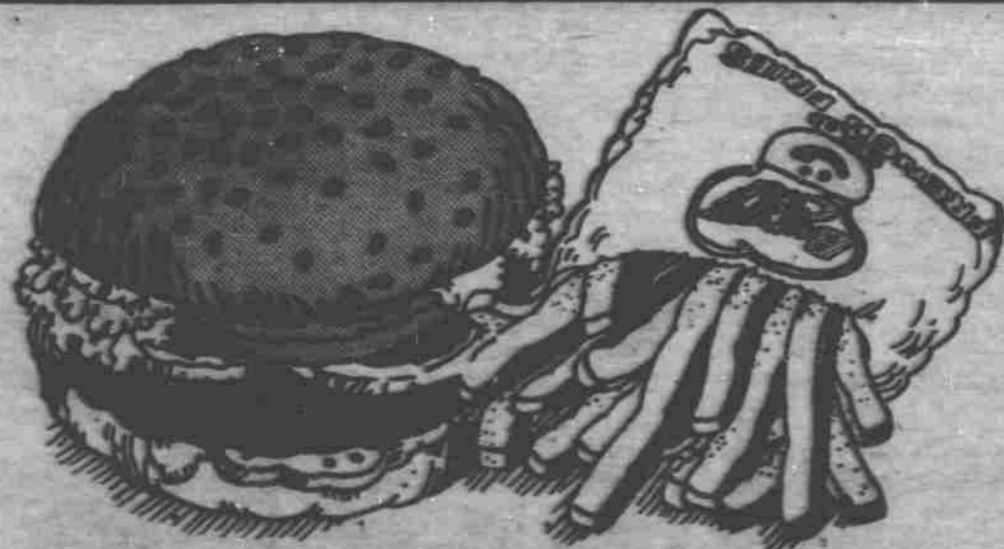
