He was selected editor by the UNL Publications Board at its Thursday night meeting.

Ruggless was associate news editor two semesters, copy editor two semesters and reporter two semesters.

Ruggless is a member of the Society of Professional Journalists, Sigma Delta Chi, and has served as an *Omaha World Herald* intern and campus correspondent.

He also is a member of the Innocents Society and Mortar Board national senior honor society.

Ruggless said he would like to expand Section B, the *Daily Nebraskan* magazine supplement to include more feature reporting. He also said he would like to include a nationally syndicated cartoon on the editorial page.
