

Dean gets anonymous \$1,000

A \$1,000 contribution was made to the NU Foundation in honor of Prof. John M. Gradwohl, a professor at the College of Law.

The contribution was made by an anonymous donor, according to Ray Hazen, Assistant Dean of the College of Law.

"The contribution was made specifically in recognition of the talents and energies of Prof. Gradwohl and the professional manner in which he has assisted and developed educational programs," Hazen said, referring to programs at the professional, graduate, and post-graduate levels.

"These activities, as well as his efforts in the professional development of his students, are cited by the donor as establishing Prof. Gradwohl as a valuable asset to the city of Lincoln and the State of Nebraska," Hazen added.

Gradwohl was instrumental in developing a wide range of continuing legal education programs in the areas of school law, estate and tax planning and recent developments for lawyers in Nebraska, Hazen said. These programs were presented by the College of Law and the Nebraska State Bar Association.

"Gradwohl also developed a unique dual degree program in Law and Education," Hazen said. He noted that the degree, which is offered by the College of Law and the Educational Administration Department in Teachers College, was the first such interdisciplinary program offered by a university in the United States.

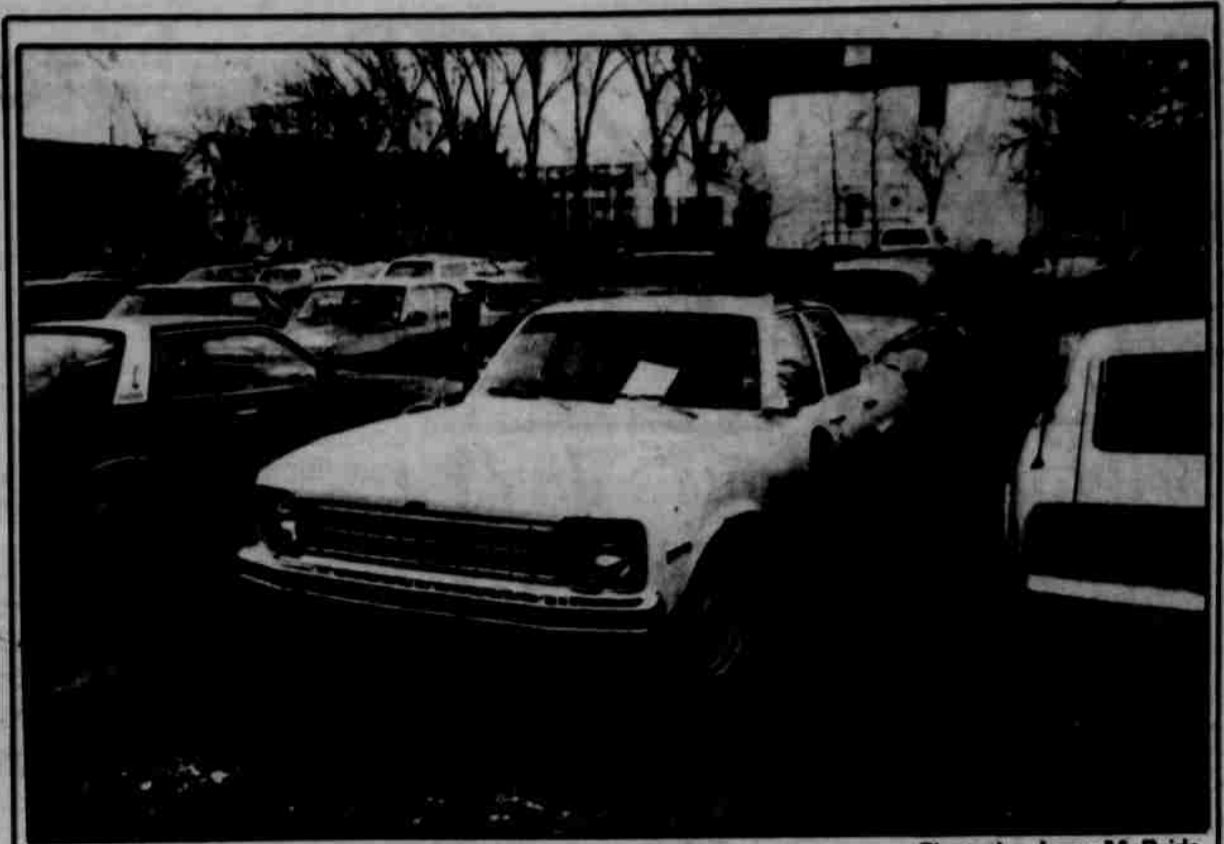
