

Allen: Our past losses will make us work harder

Nebraska's men's gymnastics team finds itself in an unusual situation this season. They have lost more meets this year than in the past three years combined.

On closer examination, that isn't as bad as it seems. Considering the Cornhuskers were undefeated last year and lost only one dual meet in each of the two seasons before that. They have lost three times this year - to Oklahoma, Iowa

State and UCLA. The losses to Oklahoma and Iowa State were avenged last Sunday and the Huskers will get a chance to avenge the UCLA defeat when the Bruins travel to Lincoln March 10 for a dual meet.

But right now Nebraska Coach Francis Allen is thinking about Southern Illinois. The Salukis invade the Bob Devaney Sports Center for a dual meet this Saturday. The meet starts at 1 p.m.

Allen said he respects Southern Illinois.

"They're an up and coming team," Allen said. "They finished third at the UCLA Invitational. They're definitely a team to contend with."

Allen said the Huskers will juggle their line-up for the Southern Illinois meet, putting Chris Riegel and Mike Bowers in the all-around competition. It will be the first time this season that Riegel has competed in the all-around.

"This meet gives us a chance to look at a few people and see how they'll look

at the nationals," Allen said.

Allen said his gymnasts are undaunted by their loss to UCLA.

"I don't think it hurt our confidence," he said. "And I don't think it should, either. UCLA is a good gymnastics team and they were hot at home. But I don't think there's any doubt that we have the best team."

Allen said there may be a positive effect from Nebraska's losses this year.
