Rivalry continues after Husker win

The friendly rivalry that exists between Nebraska and Creighton in softball was further solidified this weekend when the Cornhuskers and Lady Jays met to decide who would be crowned champion of the 1983 Husker Fall Softball Invitational.

Nebraska won the championship game 2-1 and is now 4-3 against Creighton this year.

"I enjoy a good rivalry and this is certainly one of them," said Nebraska coach Wayne Daigle. "I look forward to the stiff competition of playing a good team like Creighton."

It was evident early Sunday that Nebraska was fired up and ready to play as the top-seeded Huskers scored both of their runs in the first inning.

Nebraska's Denise Feldhaus singled, Wendy Turner doubled and Denise Day-Eckert was intentionally walked to load the bases for Ann Schroeder. The junior from Bellevue, Iowa singled to left field to drive in the two runs.

From that point on, the Huskers relied on solid defense and the five-hit pitching of Sandy Wolterman, who struck out three batters and was credited with the victory.

"We played good aggressive ball against a good team that we wanted to beat very badly," Daigle said. "The team has a great attitude and that's what it takes to win championships."

Perhaps the most exciting play of the championship game came in the top of the sixth inning, when freshman Stacy Sunny made a running catch in deep center field and then threw a perfect strike to the plate, where catcher Feldhaus tagged out Creighton's Angie Rajtora.

Daigle said he had no doubt that Sunny would make the play, saying "that's the reason I recruited her. She is a fine player."

In addition to Sunny and Schroeder, Daigle said Day-Eckert, Feldhaus (who went three for four against Creighton) and pitcher Sandy Wolterman had a good tournament.

Nebraska's road to the championship was made possible by winning all three of their games Saturday in the round robin portion of the Invitational, and then beating fourth-seeded Iowa State 4-0 Sunday morning.

Against the Cyclones, the Huskers took control of

the game in the sixth inning on three consecutive doubles by Shelby Mertins, Mori Emmons and Peggy Richardson, which produced the final three runs.

"We played exceptional ball during this tournament," Daigle said. "We hit the ball well and even though our pitching gets overlooked every game, we still showed that we do have good pitching."

Nebraska outscored their opponents 26-4 in their five tournament victories: The Huskers' record now stands at 19-4 for the fall season.

In the consolation game, Iowa State beat Wichita State 4-1.

against Kansas Friday. The Huskers split matches Saturday, losing to Drake 6-3 and beating Iowa State 8-1. Jamie Pisarcik won both of her No. 1 singles matches Saturday.

The men's team placed second in the Kansas Fall Invitational in Lawrence. Jim Carson won the No. 5 singles title in the tournament, while the No. 2 doubles team of Brian Edwards and Ashwin Vasan also claimed a title.

CROSS COUNTRY - Wally Duffy and Tom Hoffman placed fourth and fifth to lead Nebraska to a second place finish at the Illinois Invitational Saturday in Champaign.

Duffy, who transferred from Illinois, finished the 10,000-meter run at 30:36, while Hoffman finished at 30:38.

Karlene Erickson had the highest finish in the 5,000-meter course among the Husker women with a time of 17:15.

Laura Wight finished 17th and Jill Noel 22nd as the Huskers finished ninth in the 14-team field.
