## Huskers go for 100th Big Eight victory

At 12-4, Iowa State's volleyball team is off to its best start ever. If the Cyclones can beat Nebraska when the Cornhuskers play in Ames tonight, they can tie for the conference lead.

Then there's the other side. If the Huskers can beat Iowa State, not only will they beat their third conference opponent on the latter's home court, they will record their 100th victory against Big Eight competition.

For more motivation, the Huskers, 15-3 after two five-set losses in the Purdue Invitational last weekend, remember the last time they played Iowa State. The Cyclones lost the first two sets to Nebraska in the Big Eight tournament, but won the third 15-8 and went ahead early in the fourth set before Nebraska came back to win 15-11.

"We also have a couple of players on our team from Iowa," Nebraska Coach Terry Pettit said. "I'm sure Sharon's (Kramer) parents and Cathy's (Noth) father will come in for the game.

"ISU has a good team. They're 3-1 in the conference, and if they could upset us there, it would set them up pretty good," Pettit said.

In the two losses at Purdue, Pettit said, the team played hard, but the outside block was inconsistent, and the middle blockers were not getting to the outside to close off the block.

The first loss, to Kentucky, came Friday night in a game that finished at 12:30 a.m. Nebraska beat Pittsburgh Saturday afternoon, but lost to Purdue that night. The Boilermakers, who knocked Nebraska

out of the 1982 NCAA tournament in five sets, didn't play an early match Saturday.

"Purdue had a very good blocking team, and they showed us some of our weaknesses," Pettit said. "But I think to a person we'd look forward to playing them again."

Purdue came into the tournament ranked just ahead of Nebraska in both the tournament ranked just ahead of Nebraska in both the coaches' and NCAA polls, while Kentucky was ranked ahead of the Huskers in one poll, and behind them in the other.

Pettit said the setting, attacking and serving aspects of his team had developed as he expected. But, the blocking had not.

"I had hoped to be a little better blocking team at this point than we are," Pettit said.

"Last year, I thought we were a very good blocking team. This year, I'd say we were adequate."

Pettit said Karen Dahlgren, Michelle Smith and Sharon Kramer are strong competitors for the mid-

dle blocker position.

"I've moved Annie Adamczak to the outside," Pettit said. "I'm hoping that a couple of them (the middle blockers) will rise to the challenge and just take over those spots."

Whoever does that will have to be more aggressive when playing the middle back row, Pettit said. The play from that position has dropped off from last year.

Noth, a junior setter from Bettendorf, Iowa, was named the Big Eight volleyball player of the week for the second time this season for her play in the Purdue Invitational.

Noth had 21 kills in 36 attempts with two errors in the Kentucky match, for a .538 hitting percentage. For the tournament, Noth had 53 kills in 13 games, six service aces and 60 setting assists.

Noth is leading the conference in hitting percentage at .399, and is fourth in kills-per-game behind Iowa State's Diane Doles, Kansas' Lori Erickson and Husker teammate Erin Dean.

### Allen named top coach

Francis Allen, who has coached the Nebraska men's gymnastics team to five straight NCAA gymnastics titles, was named coach of the year by the United States Gymnastics Federation during its national convention in Washington D.C. last weekend.

The nation's top gymnasts in the USGF nationals and the coaches of those athletes made the choice for coach of the year.

Allen also won the title in 1981 and has been the NCAA coach of the year each of the five years Nebraska has won the team championship.
