"I needed that year to myself, just to get everything back in order, and I really enjoyed it," Duffy said.

By transferring to Nebraska, Duffy is closer to his family, which is important to him.

"My family has always been very supportive," he said. They never missed his junior high and high school races, he said, and at least one member of the family has been at every one of his races for Nebraska. "Out in Illinois," Duffy said, "I didn't have anybody to share it with."

Duffy was recruited for Illinois by present Nebraska cross country coach Jay Dirksen. Dirksen said Duffy is running better at Nebraska.

"He's a hard worker. He's working hard enough so that his goals are becoming a reality. I think he's got his best racing years-ahead of him."

Duffy said he was looking forward to coming to Nebraska. He said he knew a lot of people here through running, and it would be closer to home.

Duffy has developed his natural abilities at Nebraska through hard work, Dirksen said.

"There's no short cuts for a distance runner. He is capable of doing a lot of work," Dirksen said Duffy sets a good example through his actions, rather than his words.

Duffy said he plans to run after college as long as he keeps improving.

"I'll take my MCATs next fall," he said, "but as long as my running is going good, I want to concentrate on that."

Duffy will attempt to qualify for the Olympic trials in the Dec. 10 Rocket City Marathon in Huntsville, Ala. He has run a 2:19.07, and would need a 2:19.04 to qualify.
